F - Faithful

The "F" stands for Faithful. Good fathers are faithful people. They are faithful to God and trust Him with their whole heart, soul, and mind. Good fathers believe in God's promises, that God will preserve their families, and that God will provide their families everything needed for salvation.

Good fathers accept their role as the spiritual head of the household and set the tone for family worship. Good fathers know God's word. They have an active prayer life, attend church regularly with their families, and obey God's commandments.

The Bible lifts up the examples of several faithful fathers: Jesus' earthly father Joseph was faithful when he trusted the angel when he learned that Mary was going to give birth to Jesus. He also faithfully moved his family to Egypt when the angel warned him in a dream.

Abraham faithfully believed in God's promise that his wife Sarah would bear a son at over ninety years of age and he would be the father of a great nation.

God, as our Good Father, is faithful. He is faithfully sustaining all creation. He is faithful to His creatures providing all they need, including Salvation. His faithfulness is not dependent upon ourselves or our abilities but based in who He is.

A - Action

A - Action



In order to be good teachers, fathers must be credible and earn their children’s trust and love.

Ephesians 6:4 states: “And you, fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord.”


Paul is cautioning fathers not to be critical with their children, but instead focus on teaching them with the same love and understanding that God uses to teach them.

H - Hope



E - Example


God gave us many examples to follow.

R - Reliable


God as our Good Father is reliable. He is always there and never changes.
