1 Samuel 16:4 - So Samuel did what the Lord said, and went to Bethlehem. And the elders of the town trembled at his coming, and said, "Do you come peaceably?"

1 Samuel 16:6-7

So it was, when they came, that he looked at Eliab and said, "Surely the Lord's anointed is before Him!"

⁷ But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look at his appearance or at his physical stature, because I have refused him. For the Lord does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart."

The Choosing of David

1 Samuel 16:10-12

Thus Jesse made seven of his sons pass before Samuel. And Samuel said to Jesse, "The Lord has not chosen these." ¹¹ And Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all the young men here?" Then he said, "There remains yet the youngest, and there he is, keeping the sheep." And Samuel said to Jesse, "Send and bring him. For we will not sit down till he comes here." ¹² So he sent and brought him in. Now he *was* ruddy, with bright eyes, and goodlooking. And the Lord said, "Arise, anoint him; for this *is* the one!"

Departure to Babylon

2 Kings 24:14-16

Also he carried into captivity all Jerusalem: all the captains and all the mighty men of valor, ten thousand captives, and all the craftsmen and smiths. None remained except the poorest people of the land. ¹⁵ And he carried Jehoiachin captive to Babylon. The king's mother, the king's wives, his officers, and the mighty of the land he carried into captivity from Jerusalem to Babylon. ¹⁶ All the valiant men, seven thousand, and craftsmen and smiths, one thousand, all *who were* strong *and* fit for war, these the king of Babylon brought captive to Babylon.

Departure to Babylon

Matthew 1:11 Josiah begot <u>Jeconiah</u> and his brothers about the time they were carried away to Babylon.

Return Home

Ezra 2:1-2a

Now these *are* the people of the province who came back from the captivity, of those who had been carried away, whom Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon had carried away to Babylon, and who returned to Jerusalem and Judah, everyone to his *own* city. ² *Those* who came with Zerubbabel

Return Home

Matthew 1:12

And after they were brought to Babylon, Jeconiah begot Shealtiel, and Shealtiel begot Zerubbabel.

The Problem of a Curse

Matthew 1:11

Josiah begot Jeconiah and his brothers about the time they were carried away to Babylon.

> Jeconiah **is also known as** Cehoiachin or Coniah.

The Problem of a Curse

Jeremiah 22:28-30

"Is this man Coniah a despised, broken idol—A vessel in which *is* no pleasure? Why are they cast out, he and his descendants, And cast into a land which they do not know? ²⁹ O earth, earth, earth, Hear the word of the Lord! ³⁰ Thus says the Lord: 'Write this man down as childless, A man *who* shall not prosper in his days; For none of his descendants shall prosper, Sitting on the throne of David, And ruling anymore in Judah.' "

The Problem of a Curse

Matthew 1 is Joseph's genealogy. He is the legal heir to the throne and when he names Jesus, he is adopting him as his own with full right to that throne of David. Mary's genealogy is given in Luke 3:31 "Which was *the son* of Melea, which was *the son* of Menan, which was *the son* of Mattatha, which was *the son* of Nathan, which was *the son* of David."

Why Bethlehem?

Micah 5:2

"But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, *Though* you are little among the thousands of Judah,
Yet out of you shall come forth to Me The One to be Ruler in Israel,
Whose goings forth *are* from of old, From everlasting."

A Lesson Learned

<u>David</u> was the "least" of his brethren, yet chosen of God.
<u>Bethlehem</u> was the least of Judah, yet chosen to give birth to the Messiah.
<u>Jesus</u> was born, not is a royal palace, but in a lowly manger, and in poverty yet He was the King of Kings!
